List of Companies Engaged in Investment Activities in Iran

Recommendation: That the Board of Public Works include China Communications Construction Company Ltd. (China) and Shanghai Zhenhua Heavy Industry Company Ltd. (China) on the list of companies engaged in investment activities in Iran. Inclusion on the *Investment Activities in Iran List* would make these businesses ineligible to bid on, submit a proposal for, or enter into or renew a contract with a public body in Maryland for goods or services. Inclusion on the IAI List also bars financial institutions extending credit to those persons in certain situations from contracting with public bodies in the State. The IAI List is published on the Board of Public Works Web site.

Authority: Investment Activities in Iran Act, Chapter 447 (Laws of 2012), codified at §17-701, State Finance and Procurement Article, Annotated Code of Maryland.

Background: This law requires the Board to use credible public information to create a list of persons who are engaged in investment activities in Iran. Engaging in investment activities in Iran is defined as:

- Providing goods or services of at least \$20 million in the energy sector of Iran; or
- For financial institutions, extending credit of at least \$20.0 million to another person for at least 45 days if the person is on the Board of Public Works list and will use the credit to provide goods or services in the energy of Iran.

Before publishing the list, the Board must provide 90 days' written notice that the Board intends to include the person on the list; and that inclusion on the list makes the person ineligible to bid on, submit a proposal for, or renew a contract with a public body for goods or services.

Prior Action: Reference is made to Secretary's Agenda Item 6 (January 8, 2014), in which the Board approved the issuance of 90-day notices to China Communications Construction Company Ltd. and Shanghai Zhenhua Heavy Industry Company Ltd. Each company was given 90 days to provide written documentation demonstrating that they do not engage in investment activities in Iran.

Final List: China Communications Construction Company Ltd. and Shanghai Zhenhua Heavy Industry Company Ltd. were proposed for the IAI List in January and were notified of the Board's intended action. Both companies responded to the 90-day notice but failed to demonstrate that they are not engaged in investment activities in Iran. Accordingly, it is recommended that the Board add China Communications Construction Company Ltd. and Shanghai Zhenhua Heavy Industry Company Ltd. to the IAI List of persons* ineligible to contract with public bodies.

Holland also owns the RangeCam Track Analyst which is the software that is used to process the data compiled by these tests. MTA cannot make any changes to the software without Holland support because of proprietary rights. Holland has provided training to MTA staff to allow for adequate operation and functioning of the system; however it would be beyond Metro or Light Rail's technical expertise to troubleshoot and repair any complex problems that may develop with the database or application software. Due to the proprietary nature of the software and equipment utilized as well as the lack of sub-contractable elements, a Minority Business Enterprise goal was not established.

DESCRIPTION: The Maryland Aviation Administration is currently in the final design phase of the D/E Connector and Security Checkpoint program. This contract is for construction of the main package for the program. The D/E Connector and Security Checkpoint package consists of four (4) primary elements: the widening and renovation of the "throat" portion of Concourse D in order to comply with current life safety building code requirements; the construction of a new D/E Connector with a separate "sterile corridor" to the International Arrivals area in Concourse E; the reconfiguration of two (2) existing domestic aircraft gates into two (2) gates that will be capable of servicing either international or domestic flights; and the construction of a new passenger security screening checkpoint; and the upgrade of existing building systems to address the aging infrastructure.

REASON FOR REQUEST: These improvements will provide additional gates and associated support facilities to meet existing and projected demand for international air service. The relocation of the existing passenger screening checkpoint at Concourses D and E to a consolidated screening checkpoint will also allow the egress width to be increased to meet current building codes.

International service opportunities at BWI Marshall have been increasing. In addition to continued daily service by British Airways, the Air Mobility Command, and Air Canada, the merger of Southwest Airlines Co. /Air Tran Airways has led to increased international destinations and frequencies, and Condor Airlines has initiated service to Germany and points beyond. As a result, international passenger growth has increased over 15% during the last 12 months. Today, there are times during the day that the current six international gates are fully utilized and any additional increases in international arrivals needing Customs and Border Protection (CBP) services cannot be accommodated by the existing terminal configuration.

In addition, Southwest Airlines Co. is pursuing a business plan to increase international service across its network starting in 2015. It is anticipated that Southwest Airlines Co. will increase its international presence at BWI with new service starting in 2016 and additional service during the next five year period.

The D/E Connector project remedies the current and future shortfall in CBP access from existing gates by repositioning two domestic gates on Concourse D to a location on the D/E connector portion of the project and providing a "sterile corridor" to connect Gates D1, D3, and D5 to the CBP facility. Gates D3 and D5 are projected to be operational in Spring of 2016.

In order to provide initial facilities to handle the increased international traffic, and to address current building code egress requirements, the MAA will need to embark on a very aggressive schedule for delivery of the D/E Connector and Security Checkpoint. Construction on the enabling projects began in Spring of 2014 and design on this package is proceeding on schedule for completion in Fall of 2014. In order to deliver the project by the required schedule, construction of this package must start no later than the Winter of 2014/2015.

REMARKS

Subsequent to abandoning the initially proposed new 180-bed YDC project, DPSCS has reassessed the youth population projections based on the recent declining population figures and has now planned for a downsized 60-bed facility by renovation of the existing BPRU and OSTC instead of the new Youth Detention Center in the Baltimore Correctional Complex. The General Assembly, in its 2013 session, proposed and authorized the Capital Funds in the amount of \$2,600,000 for the design of the 60-bed facility project. The revised project program for the renovation for 60-bed facility prepared jointly by the Department of Juvenile Services (DJS) and DPSCS was approved by the Department of Budget and Management (DBM).

The proposed 60-bed facility by renovation of BPRU and a portion of OSTC will be 59,347 GSF and will provide spaces for housing, education, administration, program services (counseling, drug treatment, etc.), visitation, medical, recreation and food services.

During the schematic design reviews, DPSCS has reevaluated the existing facilities and their ability to support the approved program and determined that the existing BPRU building is not viable to support the approved program, or comply with State mandated codes and regulations. This building must be demolished and replaced with a new building. Therefore, additional A/E services are warranted through a modification to the A/E services contract in order to develop a cost efficient and functional project.

The negotiated price for the contract modification is determined to be fair and reasonable. Approval is requested for the entire modification of \$409,743.06 involving all six phases of A/E services.

TRF Lender and NMTC Lenders shall be collectively referred to herein as "Lenders", and the TRF Loan and NMTC Loans shall be collectively referred to as "Loans".
- D. Grantee hereby represents (i) that the funds obtained from the Lenders are vital to the completion of the Project and (ii) that it has been advised by the Lenders that the provisions related to the Lenders in this Agreement are a condition precedent to the Lenders making the Loans.

13. Disposition of Property. Except as set forth below, Grantee may not sell, lease, exchange, give away, or otherwise transfer or dispose of any interest in real or personal property acquired or improved with Grant funds ... Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, all rights to and any decisions concerning disposition or transfer of Grant-Funded Property which may be granted to the State in this Agreement shall be subject and subordinate to the rights of any lender to the Project. If NMTC Lenders seek to dispose or transfer Grant-Funded Property pursuant to its foreclosure rights, the NMTC Lenders shall advise the State not less than thirty (30) days prior to exercising its foreclosure rights, but shall not need the State's consent to such foreclosure except as may be required by law. Upon a foreclosure sale, the net proceeds from the sale, after deduction of all costs of the sale, shall be applied in order of priority as set forth in the Deed(s) of Trust secured by the Property. Any funds remaining may be disbursed in accordance with the Agreement and any other applicable agreements by the Grantee.

Furthermore, notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, the State hereby consents to (i) the transfer of the Grant-Funded Property to ESCC in order to facilitate the New Markets Tax Credit financing, (ii) the lease of the Grant-Funded Property by ESCC to Grantee, and (iii) any other lease by ESCC of the Grant-Funded Property, provided any such lease or leases are in the normal course of business of ESCC and consistent with the scope and purpose of the Project. The Grantee agrees to provide thirty (30) days' prior written notice to the State of any lease of the Grant-Funded Property. The State further consents to any assignment of Grantee's interests in such leases to any lender to the Project including, without limitation, any Lender.

- 15. <u>Insurance.</u> (a) For any item of Grant-Funded Property that has an original fair market value of \$5,000 or more ...
- (e) Notwithstanding anything herein to the contrary, the State agrees to subordinate to the NMTC Lenders:
 - (i) all of its right, title, interest or claim, if any, in and to the proceeds of all policies of insurance covering the Grant-Funded Property; and
 - (ii) all of its right, title and interest or claim, if any, in and to all awards or other compensation made for any taking of any part of the Grant-Funded Property. Only after all debt held by all lenders to the Project has been satisfied shall any remaining, excess insurance proceeds be disbursed to the State.
- 30. Entire Agreement. This agreement represents the complete and final understanding of the parties ... This Agreement may be executed in any number of duplicate originals or counterparts, each of such duplicate originals or counterparts shall be deemed to be an original and all taken together shall constitute but one and the same agreement. Each party to this Agreement agrees that the respective signatures of the parties may be delivered by fax, or via e-

mail of a ".pdf" version, and that the parties may rely on a signature so delivered as an original. Any party who chooses to deliver its signature in such manner agrees to provide promptly to the other parties a copy of this Agreement with its inked signature, but the party's failure to deliver a copy of this Agreement with its inked signature shall not affect the validity, enforceability and binding effect of this Agreement.

- 32. Third-Party Beneficiary; Power of Attorney. The obligations and undertakings of the State and Grantee set forth in this Agreement are also made for the benefit of the Lenders, and the Lenders are hereby, and shall be until such Assignment is terminated, an intended third party beneficiary of this Agreement. As such, the Lenders shall have the right to enforce Grantee's rights under this Agreement. Effective immediately, but to be exercised by the Lenders only upon the failure of Grantee to execute any instrument or take any action required to enforce the provisions of this Agreement within five (5) days after receipt of a written request from the Lenders to do so, Grantee hereby irrevocably constitutes and appoints the Lenders as its true and lawful attorney-in-fact with full irrevocable power and authority in the place and stead of Grantee, for the purpose of carrying out the terms of this Agreement, to take any and all appropriate action and to execute any and all documents and instruments that may be necessary or desirable to accomplish the purposes of this Agreement. The powers conferred on the Lenders hereunder are solely to protect the interests of the Lenders and shall not impose any duty upon the Lenders to exercise any such power. Except with respect to the Lenders, this Agreement shall not confer any rights or remedies upon any person other than the parties designated herein.
- (2) This action is in accordance with the enabling legislation and complies with the tax-exempt bond provisions of the Internal Revenue Code.
- (3) The grant recipient shall consult with the Maryland Historical Trust pursuant to Sections 5A-325 to 328, *State Finance and Procurement Article, Annotated Code of Maryland,* and convey a perpetual preservation easement pursuant to the terms of the enabling legislation.
- (4) The Office of Comptroller may not disburse State funds until after the Office of Comptroller verifies that the grant recipient has expended the matching fund and the required amount for reimbursement.
